"We heard about Poseidon and realised it could provide the solution.

"It cost $\pounds65,000$ to install, and there are running costs, but what happened with this young girl proves it was worth it. A life is priceless."

The girl, who has not been named, comes from Rochdale, Greater Manchester. She was believed to be in north Wales on a camping trip with a charitable foundation.

Francois Marmion, general manager of Vision IQ, which developed Poseidon, said: "It is virtually impossible for lifeguards to see everything that is happening in the pool all of the time, given the warm, noisy and crowded environment in which they work.

"It took 40 seconds for Poseidon to alert the lifeguard to this girl.

"Thankfully she made a full recovery, but just a minute or so longer under the water and she would have suffered brain damage or died."
